5.1 Financial Update



- The IGF's reference currency is the US Dollar (USD). Financial statements are converted for presentation purpose into Swiss Francs as of the year end.
- Audited assets totalled USD 14.2m on 31st December 2024 with USD 12.1 m cash at bank and in hand.
- Through prudent and tight management of supplier contracts and timeliness of implementation of human resources we were able to successfully bring both the Olympic Games operational project and delivery costs under budget.
- The IGF received \$16,558,206 as the gross contribution from the IOC for its contribution to the Paris 2024 Olympic Games.
- We have invested \$12 million in a monthly short-term investment with our bank BCV.
- We are in the process of instituting a Finance & Investment Committee that will consider an investment strategy based on the historical cashflows of the IGF through to 2028.



5.1 Financial Update



- Provided that the IGF operational model of delivery remains in place through to 2028, the IGF should have sufficient funds to continue its operations without requiring loan funds from our Delivery Partners throughout this period.
- We will continue to implement the delivery model of relying on Delivery Partner resources, and where necessary, consultants to deliver specific projects and day -to-day activities.
- As we have evolved, it has become ever more critical to recognise that achieving delivery of our strategic plan is dependent on our ability to rely upon our delivery partners to fulfil their own commitments.



5.2 2024 IGF Financial Accounts Auditors Report



- IGF's 2024 accounts were audited by Forvis Mazars and the balance sheet, profit and loss statement and notes were attached to the Meeting Agenda and Notes.
- The 2024 financial statements were prepared by Comptabilité Et Gestion SA, an independent accounting firm based in Fribourg and supervised by the IGF Executive Director.

2025 WATC

- The Singapore Golf Association provided a report to the meeting on the success of the Espirito Santo Trophy.
- The Chairman thanked the SGA for all their hard work to date and wished them every success for the **Eisenhower Trophy**

2027 WATC

- The Royal Moroccan Golf Federation provided a report to the meeting on the progress of their planning for the 2027 World Amateur Team Championships.
- The Administrative Committee supported their proposal to hold jointly both the Espirito Santo Trophy and Eisenhower Trophy concurrently on 6-9 October 2027.
- Discussions were held on the qualification system for the championships. A detailed report will be drafted following the Championships with recommendations on the qualification system for 2027 WATC to be presented to the Administrative Committee for consideration.

- The Austrian Golf Federation provided a presentation to the Administrative Committee on their bid for the 2029 World Amateur Team Championships.
- Chairman of the Bid Panel, Sidney Wolf provided the Panel's recommendation for the Administrative Committee to recommend to the Biennial Meeting that the Austrian Golf Federation be elected to host the 2029 World Amateur Team Championships.



2024 Paris Olympic Games



- Athletes from 206 **National Olympic** Committees and the **IOC** Refugee Olympic Team competed.
- 91 NOCs plus the IOC Refugee Olympic **Team won medals**
- 4 NOCs won their first medal: Albania, Cape Verde. Dominica (Gold), Saint Lucia (Gold). Botswana & Guatemala won their first Gold.

Tangible benefits

· Growth in social media following:

Olympic athletes see a notable +23% daily increase in followers, with an average gain of 621,000 during the Games. This peaks during the Olympic 'golden period' where athletes experience a +223% boost in number of followers per day.

Increased social media engagement:

during the Olympics, athletes experienced a +77% rise in daily social media engagements (averaging 132,051 interactions). Instagram leads the way, accounting for 96% of total engagement during the Games.

Enhanced media coverage:

a surge in media coverage of Olympic athletes, with x29 more news search results vs the previous year, especially in countries like the UK, Canada, South Africa.

· Olympics fuel surge in female golfers' social media growth:

Female golfers saw a significant boost in social media presence during the Olympic Games, with a 12% rise in followers compared to 3% for male players. Daily follower growth for female golfers during the Olympics also outpaced major Golf championships.

Intangible benefits

· Boost in reputation and personal brand:

the global Olympic platform strengthens the reputation/personal brand of athletes, driven by the positive sentiment surrounding their participation.

Increased visibility & influence:

athletes see a **+89**%**+ rise** in visibility post-Olympics, providing more opportunities for endorsements/sponsorships.

Emotional connection with fans:

during the Olympics 'joy' was the dominant emotion expressed, accounting for **52**% **of total volume**. Fostering a strong emotional bond between athletes and fans enhances support/admiration.

- The IOC Executive Board determined that golf was one of ten sports that would not be on the sport programme.
- The IGF provided several proposals to the IOC to ensure golf remained on the programme, but these were not seen as possible.
- The IGF has been assured by the IOC that this decision is unique to the Youth Olympic Games Dakar 2026, and any future editions of these Games will include golf on the sports programme.

IOC Session & IOC President Handover Ceremony

- The 144th IOC Session was held from 19 to 21 March at Costa Navarino in Greece.
- At the Session Kirsty Coventry of Zimbabwe was elected as the 10th President of the International Olympic Committee (IOC).
- On 23 June, Olympic Day, a ceremony at Olympic House in Lausanne was held to mark the handover of the IOC presidency from Thomas Bach to Kirsty Coventry.
- Coventry is the first woman and the first African to hold the position.









Olympic Esport Games

- The 142nd IOC Session, held in Paris, officially endorsed the establishment of the Olympic Esports Games.
- The IOC has formed a 12-year partnership with the National Olympic Committee of Saudi Arabia to support the development of the esports initiative and the hosting of the event.
- IOC confirmed that the Olympic Esports Games will now take place in 2027 to enhance the event's impact and engagement.
- The IGF has submitted two proposals a console (PGA TOUR 2K25) and a simulator (TMRW Sports) – for potential inclusion in the Olympic Esports Games Programme.
- The IOC is yet to formally announce the dates or the programme for the inaugural event.







INTERNATIONAL GOLF FEDERATION

Protection of the female category in sport

- As one of her first initiatives as IOC President, Kirsty Coventry announced the creation of an IOC working group to focus on the protection of the female category.
- The working group will be made up of experts and International Federations to ensure consensus with all the stakeholders on a clear and unequivocal policy to protect the integrity of female sport and female athletic competition would be implemented not only at the Olympic Games Los Angeles 2028 but across all Olympic sports.
- This led to the IGF Board deferring the adoption of an IGF Athlete Inclusion & Competitive Equity Policy until after the IOC working group's findings and recommendations are made.








Safeguarding

- The IGF has taken a significant step forward in our commitment to safeguarding our athletes.
- In collaboration with UNICEF and The Open University, a golf-specific Safeguarding in Sport e-learning platform has been created.
- This offers our membership valuable access to three comprehensive online courses aimed at deepening their understanding of safeguarding principles, promoting best practices, and helping them implement effective safeguarding policies for everyone involved in the golf community.
- With the availability of this platform the IGF will encourage all our National Federations to appoint a dedicated safeguarding officer to take the lead on local safeguarding efforts.
- These measures are aimed at solidifying safeguarding as a fundamental responsibility of all National Federations towards all athletes under their care.

6.4h Anti-doping

Paris 2024 anti-doping programme

- All athletes were subject to the IGF's testing authority from 26 April to 11 August 2024.Pre-Games anti-doping education was a key focus, with targeted outreach including dedicated webinars, an online education hub on the IGF website and the publication of the IGF Anti-Doping Handbook for Paris 2024, aimed at both athletes and support personnel.
- A total of 141 anti-doping tests were conducted under IGF authority in the lead-up to the Games, resulting in 100% of participating athletes being tested at least once a benchmark unmatched by any other Olympic sport. An additional six tests were conducted by the ITA during the Games on behalf of the IOC.
- There were no filing failures, adverse analytical findings (AAFs) or Anti-Doping Rule Violations (ADRVs) among tested athletes.
- In alignment with IOC protocols, a select number of samples have been securely stored for long-term reanalysis, up to a period of 10 years.
- The IGF is extremely appreciative of the collaboration and support of the LPGA, PGA TOUR and the PGA European Tour Group for the implementation of the IGF anti-doping programme.

6.4h Anti-doping

2025 WATC anti-doping programme

- Anti-doping programme for the 2025 WATC, encompasses both testing and education strategies.
- As a long-term integrity measure, eight selected samples will be securely stored for up to 10 years, allowing for future reanalysis using evolving detection methods.
- A range of anti-doping educational initiatives were implemented in the lead-up to the Championships, reinforcing our ongoing commitment to fair play and the global fight against doping in sport.
- ITA Ambassadors are on-site on registration days to speak with players.

The IGF Brisbane 2032 Paralympic Games Bid

- The development of the IGF Classification Code for the Paralympic Games is nearing conclusion, with the remaining aspects pertaining to Sport Class Classification Assessments currently in the final stage.
- The new code, once completed, will adhere fully to IPC standards, ensuring we can continue to work on golf's inclusion on the Paralympic programme.
- The Brisbane 2032 sports application process commenced in July 2025, with submissions due by December 2025. The final decision on the sports programme is expected in Q4 2026.

Classification in Para Sports



- New IPC Code rolled out in January 2025 builds on 2007 & 2015 Codes; developed through a 3-year global consultation.
- Ensures fair competition by grouping athletes by the functional impact of impairment.
- Ensures it keeps pace with the rapid evolution of Para sport and consistency across all disciplines, and provides clearer definitions & classification procedures.
- Sets rules for compliance, personnel, data, and misrepresentation and requires International Federation alignment with IPC policies.
- Stronger protest & appeal protocols, and ensures an obligation to assess the impact on athletes.
- Stronger compliance requirements for International Federations.



Paralympic Committee

New Four Stage Classification Process



- 1. Underlying Health Condition Assessment (UHC): an assessment to verify that the Player has (or has had) at least one medically and/or clinically diagnosed Underlying Health Condition, based on a review of Diagnostic Information provided by the Player's National Federation.
- 2. Eligible Impairment Assessment: an assessment to verify (i) that the Player has an Eligible Impairment that is consistent with one or more Underlying Health Conditions reported in the UHC Assessment, and (ii) that there are no inconsistencies with such reported Underlying Health Condition(s).
- 3. Minimum Impairment Criteria Assessment (MIC): an assessment as to whether a Player's Eligible Impairment meets the applicable Minimum Impairment Criteria for that Eligible Impairment.
- **4. Sport Class Assessment**: a Sport Class based on an assessment of the extent to which the Player's Eligible Impairment(s) impact(s) their ability to execute the specific tasks and activities fundamental to Para Golf; and

a Sport Class Status to indicate whether and when the Player may be required to undergo Classification in the future

IGF Sport Class Allocation



A Sport Class is a category grouping athletes by the impact of their Eligible Impairment

Allocation Process:

- Conducted after UHC, Eligible Impairment, and MIC Assessments.
- Classification Panel evaluates an athlete's functional abilities and assigns a Sport Class.
- Sport Class Status is also allocated (Confirmed (C), Review at Next Available Opportunity (R-NAO), Review with a Fixed Review Date (R-FRD), or Expired €).

Outcomes:

- Athletes with different Eligible Impairments may be grouped together if the functional impact on golf is comparable.
- Results recorded on the IGF Master List and communicated to National Federations.

IGF Eligible Impairment Sport Class Allocation:

- Physical Impairment Sitting 1 (Si1), Sitting 2 (Si2), Standing 1 (St1), Standing 2 (St2), Standing 3 (St3)
- Vision Impairment V1 & V2
- Intellectual Impairment Ii1

Role of National Federations in Classification



- Athlete Notification: Receive form from players indicating intent to undergo classification.
- Collect Diagnostic Information: Gather all required medical and diagnostic documents from the athlete.
- Submission to IGF: Ensure all information is complete, accurate, authentic, and relevant; submit to IGF.
- Information Updates: Inform IGF of any changes in athlete diagnostic information.
- Support IGF Requests: Respond to requests for additional information from IGF or UHC Assessor.
- **Documentation Standards**: Ensure diagnostic information is legible, dated, in original format or copy, with English translation if necessary.
- Athlete Support: Facilitate athlete's participation in evaluation sessions and compliance with IGF classification procedures.

In accordance with the 2029 WATC Event Bidding Rules a Bid Evaluation Panel was convened to oversee the bid process in January 2025. The role of the Panel is to evaluate bids and make recommendations to Biennial Meeting regarding preferred hosts for WATC based on evaluation criteria established by the Bidding Rules.

Following this review, the Bid Evaluation Panel has made a recommendation to the IGF membership for the Biennial Meeting to approve the appointment of the Austrian Golf Association as the Host for the 2029 WATC.

Vote by the IGF membership for Austrian Golf Federation be the host of 2029 World Amateur Team Championships

Articles 6.6 and 6.7 of the IGF Constitution states that the Women's Chair of the Administrative Committee shall be appointed at a Biennial Meeting of the National Federations and that the Women's Chair shall serve for a term of six years commencing immediately following the conclusion of one biennial World Amateur Team Championships and ending immediately following the conclusion of the biennial World Amateur Team Championships held six years thereafter.



The IGF Nominations Committee recommends to the membership that Mrs. Caroline Huyskes (Netherlands Golf Federation) be appointed by the Biennial Meeting as Women's Chair.
