2020 for BRONZE MEDAL:

C.T. Pan (TPE) won seven-man sudden-death playoff, defeating Collin Morikawa (USA) with a par-4 at the fourth extra hole (No. 18). Paul Casey (GBR) and Hideki Matsuyama (JPN) were eliminated at first extra hole with bogey-5s (No. 18).

All remaining players made par-3s at second extra hole (No. 10).

Rory McIlroy (IRL) and Mito Pereira (CHI) were eliminated at third extra hole with par-4s (No. 11). Sebastian Munoz (COL) was also eliminated at the third extra hole with a bogey-5 (No. 11).

2020: Thursday: Due to lightning, the first round was suspended at 1:55 p.m. and resumed at 4:14 p.m., a delay of 2 hours, 19 minutes.

2020: Friday: Due to lightning, the second round was suspended at 11:57 a.m. and resumed at 2:21 p.m., a delay of 2 hours, 24 minutes. Another thunderstorm forced the second round to be suspended for the day at 5:20 p.m. with 16 players left to complete round two. Round two resumed at 7:45 a.m. Saturday and was completed at 8:41 a.m. Round three began at 9:30 off Nos. 1 and 10 tees.

2024: Thursday: Due to lightning, the first round was suspended at 4:26 p.m. and resumed at 5:05 p.m., a delay of 39 minutes. Play was interrupted again at 17:26 due to lightning in the area and resumed at 18:30, a delay of 1 hour and 4 minutes.

Other Records / Notes:

2016 – 44-year-old Brazilian, Adilson da Silva, had the honor of striking the first Olympic golf shot in the modern era.

2016 – Justin Rose recorded the first hole-in-one of the new Olympic era, holing a 7-iron from 189 yards at the fourth hole.

*2020 – 2020 Tokyo Olympics were postponed due to worldwide COVID-19 pandemic and held without spectators in 2021.

2020 – Jon Rahm (ESP), World No. 1 at the qualifying deadline, and Bryson DeChambeau (USA) – were forced to withdraw following positive tests for Covid-19. They were replaced by Jorge Campillo (ESP) and Patrick Reed (USA), respectively.

2020 – 25-year-old Rikuya Hoshino from Japan hit the first tee shot at the Tokyo Olympic Men's Golf Competition

2024 - Victor Perez from France hit the opening tee shot at the 2024 men's Olympic golf competition in Paris
