## The 1994 Men's Championship



The United States team, headed by 1994 U.S. Amateur champion Eldrick (Tiger) Woods, won the World Amateur Team competition for the first time since 1982, beating its nearest challenger, Great Britain and Ireland, by 11 strokes.

Each player among the four-man U.S. team was able to count as one of the low three scorers in the four rounds of play, but it was veteran amateur Allen Doyle, of LaGrange, Ga., who finished first among the 180-players from 45 countries.

In all, it was two veterans and two college stars who brought the Eisenhower Trophy back to the American shores. Besides Doyle and Woods, an 18-year-old Stanford freshman, there was 1993 Amateur champion John Harris and 1993 NCAA champion Todd Demsey, a senior at Arizona State.

The U.S. team played the first day at La Boulie, where its three best scores (Woods, Doyle and Harris) of four combined to stand at 5-under-par 208, good enough for first

led by a scant stroke over Great Britain and Ireland; Australia was four back.

Captain C. Grant Spaeth, a former USGA president, led with his most experienced player — Doyle. However, Doyle, who had won five prominent amateur titles in 1994, suffered one misfortune after another on the first nine Sunday. He made the turn with a 40 before shooting 30 on the home nine. Over the last six holes he was brilliant, using only 23 strokes over that span. He finished birdie-birdie-eagle-par-birdie-par-birdie. He finished with a 2-under 70.

Harris, who finally found a smooth putting stroke, shot 67, the best score of the day for the entire field. He was followed by Woods, who calmly strung par after par for a 72. Only Demsey had an off day, but he had counted on the two previous days.

The Americans were not pushed during the last round, despite their narrow margin beginning the day. Only one player on the Great Britain and Ireland side could better par, a 71 by Gordon Sherry. Sweden made up enough ground to take third by three

## The 1994 Women's Championship



U.S. Women's Amateur champion Wendy Ward, who twice set the course record during the competition, led the United States to the team title by four strokes over Korea at the 1994 Women's World Team Championship, held at Le Golf National, in Versailles, France.

Ward, a 21-year-old senior at Arizona State, tied the course record with a 3-under-par 69 the first day. The San Antonio, Texas, resident then broke that mark each of the next two days with rounds of 68 and 67.

It was a brilliant team effort as well. The Americans, captained by Ann Beard, took the lead for good on the second day and went on to shoot 569, shattering the record by 10 strokes. In a format where the two lowest of three scores count, the U.S. needed to use only three scores above par over the four days, none higher than 74.

Joining Ward on the victorious team were veteran amateurs Carol Semple Thompson, of Sewickley, Pa., and Sarah LeBrun Ingram, of Nashville, Tenn. Ward's scores figured in the mix every day, while Ingram,

Mid-Amateur title, had the team's second-best score in all but the third round.

Ward was not the only player to record great scores. On the first day alone, 13 golfers shot under par. The previous high in a single day had been six players under par.

Led by Si Re Pak, Korea finished with a total of 573. On the final day of play, the 17-year-old birdied three of the first five holes, added another at the ninth to make the turn in 4-under 32, then birdied the 13th, 15th and 18th for a 7-under 65. Ward's last course record stood for 24 hours.

One stroke back in third place was Sweden, at 574. Defending champion Spain was in fourth with 575. It was a comeback of sorts for the U.S., which had suffered its worst finish ever in the 1992 competition, finishing tied for fifth.

It was the second time the Women's World Amateur was held in France. It was also there in 1964 for the inaugural competition. Twenty-five teams took part back then. This time there were 29 teams, the second-most ever.

# ARTICLES OF THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL

## ARTICLE I

The name of this council is THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL.

## ARTICLE II

### Object

### Section 1. Friendship and Sportsmanship through Golf

To encourage the International development of golf and to foster friendship and sportsmanship among the peoples of the world through the conduct biennially of Amateur Team Championships for the Eisenhower Trophy and the Espirito Santo Trophy.

### Section 2. Olympic Games

To promote golf as an Olympic Sport and to act as the Federation for golf in the Olympic Games.

### Section 3. Rules of Golf

The Championships shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, and The United States Golf Association.

## ARTICLE III

### Membership

### Section 1. Eligibility

Membership in the Council is open to any organization which is:

The national Federation, Association or Union responsible for amateur golf activities in its country; and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association.

### Section 2. Election

An application for membership shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such other data as the Administrative Committee determines.

An applicant may be elected to Membership by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

### Section 3. Finances

(a) Member Organizations shall pay annual dues, as shall be determined by the Council, payable in January of each year in the currency of the country in which the Council's Administrative Office is located—see Article IX, Section 8—unless prohibited by law or government regulation.

(b) Income from dues shall be used to defray all Council expenses. If expenses in a given year result in a deficit in the Council's account, which shall be maintained in the Administrative Office, the deficit shall be shared by those Member Organizations in the same proportion as their annual dues.

Expenses of the Council shall be limited to the following:

- (1) Cost of Administration including staff, office rent, stationery, postage, printing and other communications incurred by the Administrative Office.
- (2) Expenses including travel and hotel accommodations authorized by the Administrative Committee.
- (3) Insurance and maintenance of the Championship trophies; and
- (4) Provision of prizes.

No Member Organization may incur any expense for the Council, and no representative of the Council shall have authority to incur any expense except as expressly stated herein.

(c) Any other expense incident to the affairs of the Council shall be borne by the Member Organization whose representative incurs such expense.

(d) The expense of conducting the Championship shall be borne by the Member Organization entertaining it.

### Section 4. Obligations and Discipline

The acceptance of membership in the Council shall bind each Member Organization to uphold all the provisions of these Articles and any rules or actions of the Council or the Administrative Committee.

Any Member Organization failing in these obligations or ceasing to meet the eligibility requirements may be suspended or expelled by the Council.

### Section 5. Correspondence with Member Organizations

A Member Organization shall not circulate a memorandum to all other Member Organizations without approval of the Administrative Committee.

### Section 6. Withdrawal

Any Member Organization may withdraw from membership by notifying the Administrative Office to that effect.

Any Member Organization so withdrawing shall remain obligated for its annual dues for the year in which withdrawal occurred.

## ARTICLE IV

### Championship

### Section 1. Time

The Championship shall be held biennially, on such dates as the Council shall determine. Normally, the Championship shall be held in the last two weeks of September or the first two weeks in October.

### Section 2. Place

(a) The Championship shall be rotated among the three following zones in the order stated:

- (1) Australasian Zone—Countries of Asia, Australia, New Zealand and Oceania.
- (2) American Zone—Countries of North America, the Caribbean and South America.
- (3) European-African Zone—Countries of Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

(b) Invitations to entertain the Championship shall be submitted by Member Organizations to the Administrative Office at least nine months in advance of the Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. The Administrative Office shall inform all Member Organizations of such invitations at least one month in advance of the Meeting.

(Note: Invitations may be submitted by any Member Organization in any zone. Although invitations from the appropriate zone will, of course, be given first consideration, it is important that invitations from other zones, particularly the zone next in order, should be available in case no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from the appropriate zone. If no suitable venue is available in the appropriate zone, invitations from other zones shall be submitted at least three months in advance of the Biennial Meeting.)

At the time of submitting its invitation the Member Organization shall represent that, subject to any restrictions imposed upon it by the Government of its country, it will allow all other Member Organizations to compete if its invitation is accepted. It shall also present with its invitation a statement from a properly authorized official of the Government of its country that all Member Organizations, other than those (if any) named in the statement, will be allowed to visit the country and to compete in the Championship without any restriction whatsoever.

At a time not more than eight months and not less than seven months from the first of the month in which the Championship is to take place, both the Member Organization and a properly authorized official of the Government of its country shall reiterate the statement made in the paragraph above.

Championship invitations shall not be issued and pertinent advertising/promotion shall not be engaged in more than 3½ years in advance.

(c) The location of each Championship shall normally be determined by the Council at its Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. In reaching its decision the Council shall have regard to:

- (i) The importance of locating the Championship in the appropriate zone in accordance with Section 2(a) of this Article;
- (ii) The desirability of distributing the location of the Championship fairly among the Member Organizations in each zone; and
- (iii) The degree (if any) to which an invitation to entertain the Championship has been restricted by the Government of the country concerned.

If no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from within the appropriate zone, the Council may consider and accept any invitation which may have been received from within the zone next in order of rotation.

However, if the Council at its Biennial Meeting is unable, due to a lack of acceptable invitations or for any other reason, finally to decide the location of the next Championship, the Administrative Committee shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure the continuance of the Championship.

(d) The Council shall have the power to waive the annual dues of any Member Organization which, owing to a restriction imposed by the Government of the country in which a particular Championship is being held, has not been invited to participate in that Championship.

## ARTICLE V

### Amateur Team Championship

### Section 1. Entry Dates

Each Member Organization shall inform the Administrative Office biennially as to whether or not it will enter the Championship; such notification shall reach the Administrative Office not later than six months before the Championship. Later entries may be accepted if the Administrative Committee and the Member Organization entertaining the Championship approves.

Each Member Organization which enters the Championship shall inform the Administrative Office of the personnel of its Team not later than one month before the Championship. Substitutions may be made at any subsequent time at the pleasure of the Member Organization.

### Section 2. Qualification of Players; Amateur Status

The players comprising each Team shall be:

(a) Amateur golfers under the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews or The United States Golf Association; and

(b) Citizens of the country of the Member Organization represented, except that in cases where a Team of citizens would be impracticable, players normally resident in the country may be included.

A player with dual nationality who has played for one country in a Championship may, in the immediately following Championship, play for the other country of which he is a citizen, provided he has been a citizen of the other country for at least one year.

Each Team shall have a captain, who may be either a player or a non-player.

### Section 3. Form of Play

(a) Prior to the date for closing of entries, the Secretariat shall determine the maximum number of Teams, using two courses, which can be accepted at the selected venue. At the date of closing of entries, if the number of Teams entered does not exceed the maximum acceptable number, the Teams will consist of three or four players. If the number



then the Administrative Committee shall determine a revised format for the Championship, as it considers appropriate.

(b) The Championship shall consist of 72 holes stroke play; 18 holes each on four consecutive days of the Championship period. All the players of each Team shall be eligible for all four rounds; disqualification of a player under the Rules of Golf in any round shall not be effective for any subsequent round unless the Administrative Committee determines otherwise.

The Secretariat shall determine the starting times for each country and if two courses are used, the course on which each country plays. They shall also determine the method by which the countries are divided between the two courses for the third and fourth rounds.

In each 18-hole round, the total of the three lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

The total of the three-player Team scores for the four rounds shall be the Team's score for the Championship.

The Champion shall be the Team with the lowest such total score for 72 holes.

(c) Prior to the start of every Championship, the Administrative Committee shall decide the procedure to be adopted in the event of a tie.

#### Section 4. Prizes

(a) The Eisenhower Trophy, presented to the Council by friends of golf in the United States through The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

(b) A uniform type of prize for individuals shall be awarded to the players and the Captain of the winning Team, the second-place Team and the third-place Team.

(c) No other prizes may be accepted from any source, except symbolic gifts by a Member Organization to its Team.

#### Section 5. Championship Committee; Course Unplayable

(a) Prior to a Championship, the Administrative Committee shall appoint a Championship Committee to conduct the event. The host Member Organization shall be represented on the Championship Committee.

(b) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to decide when a Championship course is unplayable.

(c) If a Championship course is declared unplayable and as a result it is not possible to complete 72 holes of play in the period in which the Championship is scheduled, the Championship shall not be extended beyond the last scheduled day and the winner shall be the Team which returns the lowest score for the number of stipulated rounds played, except that, if it is not possible to play at least 36 holes in the four scheduled days, the Championship shall be terminated without a Champion being determined.

(d) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to schedule in advance a round of less than 18 holes, i.e., the Committee shall be authorized to declare before play begins on any day that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes; the Committee shall not be authorized to declare during play of a round that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes if the stipulated round when play began was to be 18 holes.

### ARTICLE VI

#### *Arrangements for Championship*

The Member Organization entertaining the Championship shall have the honor of and be responsible for planning and arranging for the Championship, subject to the applicable provisions of these Articles and approval by the Administrative Committee, and for all the expenses in connection therewith except the expenses of the Teams. Such Member Organization may charge admission to spectators and otherwise raise income as it may desire, and any excess of the proceeds over the expenses shall be disposed of as the Council may determine.

No financial liability shall attach to either the Council or to any Member Organization other than the Member Organization entertaining the Championship.

### ARTICLE VII

#### *Expenses of Teams*

Each Member Organization shall be responsible for the expenses of its Team's players and Captain.

### ARTICLE VIII

#### *Council Meetings*

#### Section 1. Biennial Meeting

The Council shall meet biennially on the day before the start of the Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting of the Council each Member Organization shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization, and who shall be present at the Meeting in person. Appointment of Delegates shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

#### Section 2. Quorum

Twelve Member Organizations represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting of the Council.

#### Section 3. Action Without Meeting

Between Biennial Meetings, the Council may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the Member Organizations by the Administrative Office pursuant to direction of the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 4. Majority Decision

A majority vote of the Delegates at a Biennial Meeting of the Council at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the Member Organizations in cases of action by mail, shall determine any

question before the Council, subject to any additional requirements of other provisions of these Articles.

### ARTICLE IX

#### *Administrative Committee*

#### Section 1. Composition

There shall be an Administrative Committee of thirteen persons, composed of the Chairman of the Women's Committee and twelve other persons representing ten Member Organizations; three Member Organizations in each of the three respective Zones shall be represented, together with one additional representative from the Continent of Africa. Each such person shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization he represents. If the country entertaining the next Championship is not represented in the Administrative Committee, it shall appoint a fourteenth person to serve on the Committee in a non-voting capacity.

#### Section 2. Nomination; Election

(a) The Administrative Committee shall serve as a Nominating Committee and shall propose to the Biennial Meeting eight Member Organizations to receive the right to appoint one representative each to the Administrative Committee. Additional nominations may be made by Delegates to the Biennial Meeting.

(b) At each Biennial Meeting eight Member Organizations shall be chosen, by ballot, to receive the right to appoint one representative (or substitute) each to the Administrative Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years. The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association shall be permanently entitled to appoint two representatives.

(c) Each Member Organization so chosen shall promptly appoint its representative to the Administrative Committee and give the Administrative Office notification of the appointment. If a Delegate of any Member Organization so chosen is present at the Biennial Meeting, he shall thereupon become the appointee of his Member Organization to the Administrative Committee.

(d) A Member Organization shall have the right to change its appointee to the Administrative Committee, any such change shall become effective when the Administrative Office receives notification thereof.

#### Section 3. Duties

The Administrative Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Council, subject to the provisions of these Articles and to directions of the Council.

#### Section 4. Meetings

The retiring Administrative Committee shall meet immediately prior to the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

The Administrative Committee newly determined at the Biennial Meeting of the Council shall meet immediately after the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

#### Section 5. Quorum

Four members present in person representing at least six Member Organizations shall constitute a quorum of the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 6. Action Between Meetings

Between meetings, the Administrative Committee may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the representatives to the Administrative Committee by the Administrative Office.

#### Section 7. Majority Decision

A majority vote at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the entire Administrative Committee in case of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 8. Administrative Office

The Council's Administrative Office is located at Golf House, Far Hills, N.J., U.S.A. The Administrative Office shall keep the records of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, give notices of all meetings and conduct all votes by mail, carry on the correspondence of the Council, and perform all other customary duties.

### ARTICLE X

#### *Officers*

#### Section 1. Titles; Election

The officers of the Council shall be two Joint Chairmen who shall be representatives of and appointed by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, and two Joint Secretaries. The Joint Chairmen shall each be one of the representatives to the Administrative Committee. The Secretariat shall be appointed by the Administrative Committee.

#### Section 2. Chairman

One of the Joint-Chairmen shall preside at meetings of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, and in general shall perform the customary duties of his office.

### ARTICLE XI

#### *Language*

The official language of the Council is English.

### ARTICLE XII

#### *Care of Trophy*

#### Section 1. Protection

The United States Golf Association shall retain title to the Championship Trophy, and shall make arrangements for its insurance and for its safekeeping during any suspension of the Championship.

#### Section 2. Dissolution of Council

In the event of dissolution of the Council, such use or other disposition of the Championship Trophy shall be made as The United States Golf Association may in its discretion determine.

### ARTICLE XIII

#### *Amendments*

These articles may be amended by action of the Council, provided, however, that the provisions of

these Articles with respect to the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status shall not be amended without the unanimous affirmative vote of the Member Organizations; that the provisions of these Articles with respect to permanent representation to the Administrative Committee shall not be amended without the affirmative votes of the respective Member Organizations concerned; and that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the ownership and custody of the Championship Trophy shall not be amended without the affirmative vote of The United States Golf Association.

## ARTICLE XIV

### *Women's Amateur Team Championship*

#### Section 1. Regulations

The Council shall conduct biennially a Women's Amateur Team Championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy, open to Teams representing Member Organizations of the Women's Division.

All relevant provisions and principles of Articles IV, V, VI, VII and XII shall apply except as follows:

Each Team shall consist of two or three players. In each 18-hole round, the total of the two lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

#### Section 2. Place and Time

The place and the time of the Women's Amateur Team Championship shall be determined by the Council. The Championship shall be held as near as feasible geographically to the Men's Championship and in an adjacent week or concurrently but preferably before the Men's Championship.

#### Section 3. Prizes

The Espirito Santo Trophy, presented to the Council by the family of Ricardo Espirito Santo through the Portuguese Golf Federation, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

In the event of abandonment of the Women's Amateur Team Championship, such use or other disposition of the Espirito Santo Trophy shall be made as the Portuguese Golf Federation may in its discretion determine.

## ARTICLE XV

### *Women's Division*

All relevant provisions and principles of the Articles shall apply to the Women's Division except as follows:

#### Section 1. Membership

Membership in the Women's Division is open to any organization which either:

(a) Is a Member Organization of the Council and has jurisdiction of women's amateur golf in its country. An application from a Member Organization of the Council for membership in the Women's Division shall be granted automatically.

—OR—

(b) Is responsible for women's amateur golf in its country and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association. An application from such an organization shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such data as the Administrative Committee determines. Such an applicant may be elected by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

#### Section 2. Finances

The principles of Article III, Section 3, shall apply to Women's Division Members to defray all Council expenses relating to women's events.

#### Section 3. Biennial Meeting

The Women's Division shall meet biennially two days before the start of the Women's Amateur Team Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting each Member Organization of the Women's Division shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be present in person and whose appointment shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

Eight Member Organizations of the Women's Division represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting.

#### Section 4. Women's Committee; Chairman

There shall be a Women's Committee of nine persons representing nine Member Organizations of the Women's Division, three from each of the three respective Zones. At each Biennial Meeting there shall be chosen by ballot the nine Member Organizations which shall be entitled to appoint representatives to the Women's Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years.

One of these nine Member Organizations shall be chosen biennially by ballot to serve as Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee. No one person's appointed term of office as Chairman shall exceed six consecutive years.

#### Section 5. Duties of Women's Committee

The Women's Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Women's Division, subject to directions of the Council, and shall advise the Council on matters relative to the Women's Amateur Team Championship. Matters of policy shall be determined by the Council.
