France Wins The 2000 Women's Championship

Fielding one-half of the team that captured the Womens' European Amateur Team Championship in 1999 on its home soil, France took the lead after two rounds and never slowed as it produced a seven-stroke victory over Korea at Sporting Club Berlin in Bad Saarow, Germany. It reclaimed the Espirito Santo Trophy 36 years after capturing the inaugural playing on its home soil, a span during which it five times earned a silver medal.

Maitena Alsuguren (289), Karine Icher (292) and Virginie Auffret (307) became the first players to hold the European and World titles concurrently after shooting 4-over-par 580 at the demanding Nick Faldo Course. In addition their captain, Gwladys Nocera, 25, a former player now in her fourth season as an assistant coach at New Mexico State University, became the youngest winning captain in Espirito Santo history.

Korea, the 1996 champion with no worse than a tie for fourth since 1994, finished four strokes ahead of Great Britain and Ireland, a non-winner that has earned a silver or bronze medal on seven occasions.

Periodic rainstorms in the days preceding the championship left the course playing longer than its 6,155 yards (5,626 meters), but by the end of the week steady winds had it running hard and fast. The conditions were a challenge for the record 40 countries that included first-time entrants Greece, Malaysia, Russian Federation and Slovakia.

Denmark, which had never been placed in the top 10 until two years ago in Santiago,

2-under 70, the second-best individual score on a day that began with more rain. But France took command the next day as all three players scored no worse than 74 despite playing in the round's strongest winds. Alsuguren shot 72, one of only 10 players to match or better par, while Auffret's 73 bettered her opening round by 10 shots.

"It was too much pressure yesterday," a relieved Auffret conceded, "because it was my first time in the World Championship."

Alsuguren's bogey-free 67, during which she needed only 30 putts, tied the record for lowest third round by an individual

and propelled France to a six-shot cushion over Korea and GBI. Not since Wendy Ward of the United States of America shot that score in 1994 in Paris, France, had a player enjoyed such a commanding performance.

Icher provided the balance in the final

round, shooting a 71 in the week's most difficult conditions while Auffret contributed with a 76. Nocera, their captain, attested to the value of the team's preparations, which began two years earlier when France stumbled to a disappointing sixth-place finish after being an early contender. For two years the players followed a daily stretching and exercise regimen, and dietary guidelines.

"It is not a sacrifice," Nocera said. "It's not strict when you want to be number one. You have to make some decisions. It is wanting to do it."

Although no individual honors are presented, Suzann Pettersen of Norway shot 3-under 285, the week's only sub-par

United States Wins The 2000 Men's Championship

Enduring raw and rainy conditions during the final round, the United States of America erased the disappointment of its last two performances and recorded a 16-stroke victory over defending champion Great Britain and Ireland at Sporting Club Berlin in Bad Saarow, Germany.

The USA total of 23-under-par 841 secured the third-widest margin of victory in the event's 22 playings and followed its only finishes outside the top five, in 1996 (ninth) and 1998 (seventh). The triumph was even more remarkable considering the team's lineup was completed two days before the flag-raising ceremony, with Jeff Quinney soaring across the Atlantic Ocean only hours after winning the U.S. Amateur in a Monday finish.

USA set the pace after each round, earning a first-day tie with Canada on the strength of a 5-under-par 67 by David Eger, a 48-year-old veteran who was part of the silver-medal squad in 1990 in Christchurch, New Zealand. Eger birdied each of the last four holes to establish the Palmer Course record and lift his team level with Canada.

Germany recorded a valiant 10-under 206 over the Palmer Course in the second round, moving within a stroke of USA's 423 total. Germany, which had never placed higher than sixth, was attempting to become only the second nation to win on home soil, duplicating the USA's feats of 1960 and 1980. The same round saw 34 players shoot par or better in ideal conditions, shattering the championship record for most sub-par scores in a second round. That included a 64 on the Palmer by Japan's Yasuki Mizogata, 20, the

six strokes to par in the last three holes of the third round as his team missed the bronze medal by one stroke.

USA shrugged off a 37-minute lightning delay in the third round and strode to a seven-shot lead over Germany, its 11-under 205 on the Palmer standing as the lowest return of any day. The courses had been soaked by a furious overnight storm that dropped more than an inch of rain, washing out bunkers and leaving standing water on several fairways.

The horrid weather spilled into the final round, with players fighting against occasional torrential downpours that all but assured no challenger could mount a comeback. Bryce Molder, 21, named one of the best college players in the USA during his previous season at

Georgia Tech, finished off his 15-under 273 total with a solid 68 on the harder Faldo layout.

"A little bit earlier in the week, during one of our team meetings, I mentioned that it was so nice to have a chance to compete as a team instead of as individuals," Molder said. "Very rarely do we get to celebrate a victory with someone other than family and friends."

The triumph made Judy Bell the first woman to captain a team earning the Eisenhower Trophy. Ironically, she never played in the Women's WATC for the Espirito Santo Trophy; the peak of her career preceded the event's debut in 1964. She did captain the victorious women's squad in 1988.

A record of 59 teams took part, seven more than played in Chile two years

ARTICLES OF THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL

ARTICLE I

The name of this council is THE WORLD AMATEUR GOLF COUNCIL.

ARTICLE II

Object

Section 1. Friendship and Sportsmanship through Golf

To encourage the international development of golf and to foster friendship and sportsmanship among the peoples of the world through the conduct biennially of Amateur Team Championships for the Eisenhower Trophy and the Espirito Santo Trophy.

Section 2. Olympic Games

To promote golf as an Olympic sport and to act as the Federation for golf in the Olympic Games.

Section 3. Rules of Golf

The Championship shall be conducted in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, and The United States Golf Association.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Section 1. Eligibility

Membership in the Council is open to:

The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, and the United States Golf Association, as the governing bodies of the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status; and

Any organization which is the National Federation, Association or Union responsible for amateur golf activities in its country; and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association.

Section 2. Election

An application for membership shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such other data as the Administrative Committee determines.

An applicant may be elected to Membership by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

Section 3. Finances

(a) Member Organizations shall pay annual dues, as shall be determined by the Council, payable in January of each year in the currency of the country in which the Council's Administrative Office is located - see Article IX, Section 8 - unless prohibited by law or government regulation.

(b) Income from dues shall be used to defray all Council expenses. If expenses in a given year result in a deficit in

Expenses of the Council shall be limited to the following:

(1) Cost of Administration including staff, office rent, stationery, postage, printing and other communications incurred by the Administrative Office.

(2) Expenses including travel and hotel accommodation authorized by the Administrative Committee.

(3) Insurance and maintenance of the Championship trophies; and

(4) Provision of prizes

No Member Organization may incur any expense for the Council, and no representative of the Council shall have authority to incur any expense except as expressly stated herein.

(c) Any other expense incident to the affairs of the Council shall be borne by the Member Organization whose representative incurs such expense.

(d) The expense of conducting the Championship shall be borne by the Member Organization entertaining it.

Section 4. Obligations and Discipline

The acceptance of membership in the Council shall bind each Member Organization to uphold all the provisions of these Articles and any rules or actions of the Council or the Administrative Committee.

Any Member Organization failing in these obligations or ceasing to meet the eligibility requirements may be suspended or expelled by the Council.

Section 5. Correspondence with Member Organizations

A Member Organization shall not circulate a memorandum to all other Member Organizations without approval of the Administrative Committee.

Section 6. Withdrawal

Any Member Organization may withdraw from membership by notifying the Administrative Office to that effect.

Any Member Organization so withdrawing shall remain obligated for its annual dues for the year in which withdrawal occurred.

ARTICLE IV

Championship

Section 1. Time

The Championship shall be held biennially, on such dates as the Council shall determine. Normally, the Championship shall be held in the last two weeks of September or the first two weeks in October.

Section 2. Place

(a) The Championship shall be rotated among the three following Zones in the order stated:

(3) European-African Zone — Countries of Europe, Africa and the Middle East.

(b) Invitations to entertain the Championship shall be submitted by Member Organizations to the Administrative Office at least nine months in advance of the Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. The Administrative Office shall inform all Member Organizations of such invitations at least one month in advance of the Meeting.

(Note: Invitations may be submitted by any Member Organization in any Zone. Although invitations from the appropriate Zone will, of course, be given first consideration, it is important that invitations from other Zones, particularly the Zone next in order, should be available in case no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from the appropriate Zone. If no suitable venue is available in the appropriate Zone, invitations from other Zones shall be submitted at least three months in advance of the Biennial Meeting.)

At the time of submitting its invitation the Member Organization shall represent that, subject to any restrictions imposed upon it by the Government of its country, it will allow all other Member Organizations to compete if its invitation is accepted. It shall also present with its invitation a statement from a properly authorized official of the Government of its country that all Member Organizations, other than those (if any) named in the statement, will be allowed to visit the country and to compete in the Championship without any restriction whatsoever.

At a time not more than eight months and not less than seven months from the first of the month in which the Championship is to take place, both the Member Organization and a properly authorized official of the Government of its country shall reiterate the statement made in the paragraph above.

Championship invitations shall not be issued and pertinent advertising/promotion shall not be engaged in more than 36 years in advance.

(c) The location of each Championship shall normally be determined by the Council at its Biennial Meeting immediately preceding. In reaching its decision the Council shall have regard to:

(1) The importance of locating the Championship in the appropriate Zone in accordance with Section 2(a) of this Article; and

(2) The degree (if any) to which an invitation to entertain the Championship has been restricted by the Government of the country concerned.

If no invitation acceptable to the Council has been received from within the appropriate Zone, the Council may consider and accept any invitation which may have been received from within the Zone next in order of rotation.

However, if the Council at its Biennial Meeting is unable, due to a lack of acceptable invitations or for any other reason, finally to decide the location of the next Championship, the Administrative Committee shall take such steps as are necessary to ensure the continuance of the Championship.

(d) The Council shall have the power to waive the annual dues of any Member Organization which, owing to a restriction

ARTICLE V *Amateur Team Championship*

Section 1. Entry Dates

Each Member Organization shall inform the Administrative Office biennially as to whether or not it will enter the Championship; such notification shall reach the Administrative Office not later than six months before the Championship. Later entries may be accepted if the Administrative Committee and the Member Organization entertaining the Championship approves.

Each Member Organization which enters the Championship shall inform the Administrative Office of the personnel of its Team not later than one month before the Championship. Substitutions may be made at any subsequent time at the pleasure of the Member Organization.

The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, shall not be entitled to enter a team from Great Britain & Ireland in any year in which teams are entered by the Golf Unions of England, Ireland, Scotland, and Wales.

Section 2. Qualification of Players; Amateur Status

The players comprising each Team shall be:

(a) Amateur golfers under the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews or The United States Golf Association; and

(b) Citizens of the country of the Member Organization represented, except that in cases where a Team of citizens would be impracticable, players normally resident in the country may be included.

A player with dual nationality who has played for one country in a Championship play, in the immediately following Championship, may for the other country of which he is a citizen, provided he has been a citizen of the other country for at least one year.

Each Team shall have a Captain, who may be either a player or a non-player.

Section 3. Form of Play

(a) Prior to the date for closing of entries, the Joint Secretaries shall determine the maximum number of Teams, using two courses, which can be accepted at the selected venue. At the date of closing of entries, if the number of Teams entered does not exceed the maximum acceptable number, the Teams will consist of three or four players. If the number of Teams entered exceeds the maximum acceptable, then the Administrative Committee shall determine a revised format for the Championship, as it considers appropriate.

(b) The Championship shall consist of 72 holes stroke play; 18 holes each on four consecutive days of the Championship period. All the players of each Team shall be eligible for all four rounds; disqualification of a player under the Rules of Golf in any round shall not be effective for any subsequent round unless the Administrative Committee determines otherwise.

The Administrative Committee shall determine the starting times for each country and if two courses are used, the course

In each 18-hole round, the total of the three lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

The total of the three-player Team scores for the four rounds shall be the Team's score for the Championship.

The Champion shall be the Team with the lowest such total score for 72 holes.

(c) Prior to the start of every Championship, the Administrative Committee shall decide the procedure to be adopted in the event of a tie.

Section 4. Prizes

(a) The Eisenhower Trophy, presented to the Council by friends of golf in the United States through The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

(b) A uniform type of prize for individuals shall be awarded to the players and the Captain of the winning Team, the second-place Team and the third-place Team.

(c) No other prizes may be accepted from any source, except symbolic gifts by a Member Organization to its Team.

Section 5. Championship Committee; Course Unplayable

(a) Prior to a Championship, the Administrative Committee shall appoint a Championship Committee to conduct the event. The host Member Organization shall be represented on the Championship Committee.

(b) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to decide when a Championship course is unplayable.

(c) If a Championship course is declared unplayable and as a result it is not possible to complete 72 holes of play in the period in which the Championship is scheduled, the Championship shall not be extended beyond the last scheduled day and the winner shall be the Team which returns the lowest score for the number of stipulated rounds played, except that, if it is not possible to play at least 36 holes in the four scheduled days, the Championship shall be terminated without a Champion being determined.

(d) The Championship Committee shall be authorized to schedule in advance a round of less than 18 holes, i.e., the Committee shall be authorized to declare before play begins on any day that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes; the Committee shall not be authorized to declare during play of a round that the stipulated round for that day shall be, for example, nine holes if the stipulated round when play began was to be 18 holes.

ARTICLE VI *Arrangements for Championship*

The Member Organization entertaining the Championship shall have the honor of and be responsible for planning and arranging for the Championship, subject to the applicable provisions of these Articles and approval by the Administrative Committee, and for all the expenses in connection therewith except the expenses of the Teams. Such Member Organization

No financial liability shall attach to either the Council or to any Member Organization other than the Member Organization entertaining the Championship.

ARTICLE VII *Expenses of Teams*

Each Member Organization shall be responsible for the expenses of its Team's players and Captain.

ARTICLE VIII *Council Meetings*

Section 1. Biennial Meeting

The Council shall meet biennially on the day before the start of the Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting of the Council each Member Organization shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization, and who shall be present at the Meeting in person. Appointment of Delegates shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

Section 2. Quorum

Twelve Member Organizations represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting of the Council.

Section 3. Action Without Meeting

Between Biennial Meetings, the Council may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the Member Organizations by the Administrative Office pursuant to direction of the Administrative Committee.

Section 4. Majority Decision

A majority vote of the Delegates at a Biennial Meeting of the Council at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the Member Organizations in cases of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Council, subject to any additional requirements of other provisions of these Articles.

ARTICLE IX *Administrative Committee*

Section 1. Composition

There shall be an Administrative Committee of 15 persons, composed of the Chairman of the Women's Committee and 14 other persons representing 12 Member Organizations; four Member Organizations in each of the three respective Zones shall be represented, with at least one of the Member Organizations in the European-African Zone being from the Continent of Africa. Each such person shall be a citizen or normally a resident of the country of the Member Organization he/she represents. Any country entertaining a future Championship that is not represented in the Administrative Committee shall be entitled to one representative to serve on the Committee in a non-voting capacity.

Section 2. Nomination; Election

(a) The Administrative Committee shall serve as a Nominating

Additional nominations may be made by Delegates to the Biennial Meeting.

(b) At each Biennial Meeting 10 Member Organizations shall be chosen, by ballot, to receive the right to appoint one representative (or substitute) each to the Administrative Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years. The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association shall be permanently entitled to appoint two representatives.

(c) Each Member Organization so chosen shall promptly appoint its representative to the Administrative Committee and give the Administrative Office notification of the appointment. If a Delegate of any Member Organization so chosen is present at the Biennial Meeting, he shall thereupon become the appointee of his Member Organization to the Administrative Committee.

(d) A Member Organization shall have the right to change its appointee to the Administrative Committee, any such change shall become effective when the Administrative Office receives notification thereof.

Section 3. Duties

The Administrative Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Council, subject to the provisions of these Articles and to directions of the Council.

Section 4. Meetings

The retiring Administrative Committee shall meet immediately prior to the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

The Administrative Committee newly determined at the Biennial Meeting of the Council shall meet immediately after the Biennial Meeting of the Council.

Section 5. Quorum

Four members present in person representing at least six Member Organizations shall constitute a quorum of the Administrative Committee.

Section 6. Action Between Meetings

Between meetings, the Administrative Committee may take action by mail vote on resolutions submitted to the representatives to the Administrative Committee by the Administrative Office.

Section 7. Majority Decision

A majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present, or a majority vote of the entire Administrative Committee in case of action by mail, shall determine any question before the Administrative Committee.

Section 8. Administrative Office

The Council's Administrative Office is located at Golf House, Far Hills, N.J., USA. The Administrative Office shall keep the records of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, give notices of all meetings and conduct all votes by mail, carry on the correspondence of the Council, and perform all other customary duties.

ARTICLE X Officers

Section 1. Titles; Election

The officers of the Council shall be two Joint Chairmen, who shall be representatives of and appointed by The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews and The United States Golf Association, and two Joint Secretaries. The Joint Chairmen shall each be one of the representatives to the Administrative Committee. The Joint Secretaries shall be appointed by the Administrative Committee.

Section 2. Chairman

One of the Joint Chairmen shall preside at meetings of the Council and of the Administrative Committee, and in general shall perform the customary duties of his office.

ARTICLE XI Language

The official language of the Council is English.

ARTICLE XII Care of Trophy

Section 1. Protection

The United States Golf Association shall retain title to the Championship Trophy, and shall make arrangements for its insurance and for its safekeeping during any suspension of the Championship.

Section 2. Dissolution of Council

In the event of dissolution of the Council, such use or other disposition of the Championship Trophy shall be made as The United States Golf Association may in its discretion determine.

ARTICLE XIII Amendments

These Articles may be amended by action of the Council, provided, however, that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status shall not be amended without the unanimous affirmative vote of the Member Organizations; that the provisions of these Articles with respect to permanent representation to the Administrative Committee shall not be amended without the affirmative votes of the respective Member Organizations concerned; and that the provisions of these Articles with respect to the ownership and custody of the Championship Trophy shall not be amended without the affirmative vote of The United States Golf Association.

ARTICLE XIV Women's Amateur Team Championship

Section 1. Regulations

The Council shall conduct biennially a Women's Amateur Team Championship for the Espirito Santo Trophy, open to Teams representing Member Organizations of the Women's Division.

All relevant provisions and principles of Articles IV, V, VI, VII and XII shall apply except as follows:

Each Team shall consist of two or three players. In each 18-hole round, the total of the two lowest scores by players of each Team shall constitute the Team score for that round.

Section 2. Place and Time

The place and the time of the Women's Amateur Team Championship shall be determined by the Council. The Championship shall be held as near as feasible geographically to the Men's Championship and in an adjacent week or concurrently but preferably before the Men's Championship.

Section 3. Prizes

The Espirito Santo Trophy, presented to the Council by the family of Ricardo Espirito Santo through the Portuguese Golf Federation, shall be held for the ensuing biennium by the Member Organization whose Team is the winner.

In the event of abandonment of the Women's Amateur Team Championship, such use or other disposition of the Espirito Santo Trophy shall be made as the Portuguese Golf Federation may in its discretion determine.

ARTICLE XV Women's Division

All relevant provisions and principles of the Articles shall apply to the Women's Division except as follows:

Section 1. Membership

Membership in the Women's Division is open to any organization which either:

(a) Is a Member Organization of the Council and has jurisdiction of women's amateur golf in its country. An application from a Member Organization of the Council for membership in the Women's Division shall be granted automatically.

— OR —

(b) Is responsible for women's amateur golf in its country and observes the Rules of Golf and the Rules of Amateur Status of either The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews, Scotland, or The United States Golf Association. An application from such an organization shall be supported by copies of the applicant's constitution and by-laws or similar documents and such data as the Administrative Committee determines. Such an applicant may be elected by the Council after determination by the Administrative Committee that the requirements for membership have been met.

Section 2. Finances

The principles of Article III, Section 3, shall apply to Women's Division Members to defray all Council expenses relating to women's events.

Section 3. Biennial Meeting

The Women's Division shall meet biennially two days before the start of the Women's Amateur Team Championship and at the place of the Championship.

At a Biennial Meeting each Member Organization of the Women's Division shall be entitled to be represented by one Delegate, who shall be present in person and whose appointment shall be certified to the Administrative Office in advance.

Eight Member Organizations of the Women's Division represented by Delegates present in person shall constitute a quorum at a Biennial Meeting.

Section 4. Women's Committee; Chairman Women's Committee

There shall be a Women's Committee of 11 persons, composed of the Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee, and 10 other persons representing 10 Member Organizations. Three Member Organizations in each of the respective Zones will be represented, along with an additional representative from the continent of Africa. Any country entertaining a future Championship that is not represented in the Women's Committee shall be entitled to one representative to serve on the Committee in a non-voting capacity.

At each Biennial Meeting there shall be chosen, by ballot, the nine Member Organizations which shall be entitled to appoint representatives to the Women's Committee, to serve for the ensuing two years.

Chairman

A woman from the appropriate Zone shall be chosen by ballot to serve as Chairman of the Women's Division and the Women's Committee for up to a maximum of six years. The Member Organization of the Chairman shall be entitled to two representatives, including the Chairman.

The Chairman shall be chosen among the three Zones on a rotational basis.

Section 5. Duties of Women's Committee

The Women's Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Women's Division, subject to directions of the Council, and shall advise the Council on matters relative to the Women's Amateur Team Championship. Matters of policy shall be determined by the Council.
